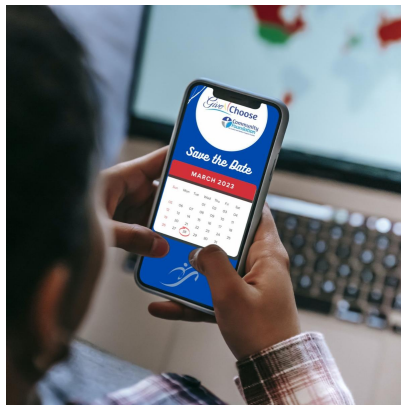

Students who are Asian, Hispanic, Black, and/or Pacific Islander now make up 57% of the LCPS student body.

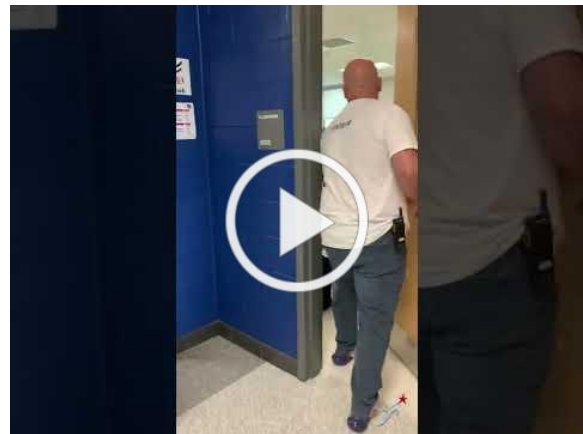
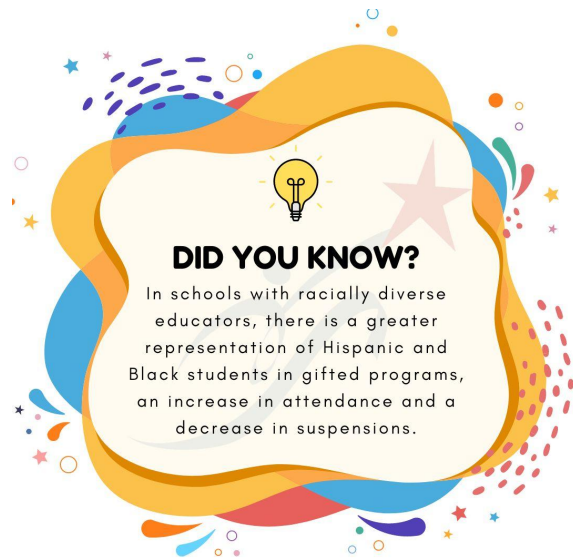
We want to support aspiring educators who are from populations under-represented in the profession.
